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ACADEMIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE AUDIT REPORT FROM THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-22 AND 2022-23

PREAMBLE

Chitradurga has an ancient history. Archeological remains found in the area trace its history to the 3rd millennium B.C. Chitradurga was ruled by feudatories under all important imperial Dynasties, namely: Shatavahanas, Kadambas, Chalukyas, Rashtrakutas, Hoysalas and Vijayanagara. After the fall of Vijayanagara empire in South India, the feudatory of Chitradurga became an independent ruler in 16th century popularly known as "PALEGARS". The thirteen rulers ruled from 16th to 18th century for more than 200 years. Bharamanna Nayaka and Medakeri Nayaka were the prominent rulers of that time.

It is located at a distance of 202 Kms North West of Bangalore, which is the capital city of Karnataka State and is situated adjacent to busy National Highway no.4 connecting Pune and Bangalore, as well as National Highway No. 13 connecting Sholapur and Mangalore. This district covers geographical area of 8442 sq kms with 1044 villages. It is a recognized tourist centre by the Department of Tourism of Government of Karnataka. The other special feature of Chitradurga District is that it is heading towards becoming a 2nd Scientific Research Centre in the Country with the establishment of the brances of pristagious premier Science Institutions like IISc, DRDO, BARC etc., at Challakere.
